

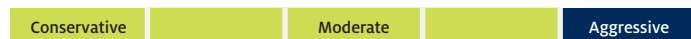

Portfolio objective

This portfolio combines the attractive features of the Multi-National Fund with valuable investment guarantees. 60% of the portfolio is invested in the STANLIB Multi-National Fund - the remainder is invested in Government bonds and money market instruments. The performance objective is long-term capital and income growth consistent with an element of stability. The investor benefits from rand hedge growth with the security of capital guarantees.

Quarterly commentary (3rd quarter)**Fund Review**

The S&P500 index lost 14.3% for the 3rd quarter, its worst since December 2008. August and September were particularly volatile months, with the VIX index of implied volatility rising off its low of 16.5 at June end and not declining below 30 for the rest of the quarter. The 2nd quarter earnings reports by listed companies were broadly favourable with 71% beating investor expectations. However, investors were nervous and commodity and cyclical sectors were particularly hard hit. The US dollar rallied over the quarter as investors sought refuge at the expense of emerging market currencies. Over the quarter the Rand depreciated by 16.5% against the dollar, making it the worst performing currency year to date. Oil markets had to contend with two positively correlated drivers, namely a weakening growth outlook and the return of Libyan supply. This caused spot Brent crude oil to weaken by 4.6% during the quarter. Spot gold gained 7.4% over the quarter but was volatile.

On the South African side of the Fund we made no changes to the holdings. Within the Fund we continue to favour oil, diversified mining houses, and mobile telephone sectors. Based on this the Fund has large exposures to Sasol (oil play), BHPBilliton and Anglo American (diversified mining houses) and MTN (mobile telephones). We continue to favour MTN because of its growth profile in Nigeria and Iran coupled to its increasing dividend payout ratio. BHPBilliton is a well managed, massively cash generative mining company that has exposure to many various commodities. BHPBilliton continues to pay decent dividends and buy back shares, which underpins shareholder value.

The offshore component of the Fund remains invested in the counters that make up the constituents of the Dow Jones Titans Index. At a sectoral level the Fund has exposure to financials, IT, healthcare and telco's shares. Offshore shares invested in the Fund include APPLE Inc, Bank of America and Vodafone Group Plc. These are all large cap, liquid shares.

Looking Ahead

Going into the 4th quarter of 2011, our preference is for global equities versus South African equities. We are of the opinion that the easy returns have been generated in the South African market, while the global equity valuations still remain compelling. Should the South African Rand continue to depreciate against foreign currencies during 2011, this will assist the performance of the Fund's offshore component.

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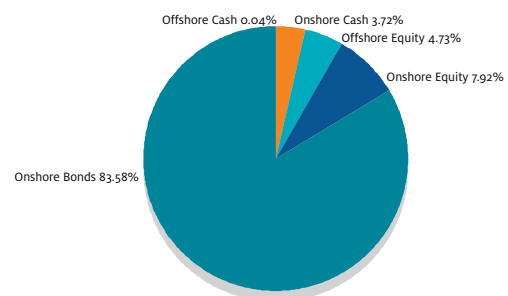
